

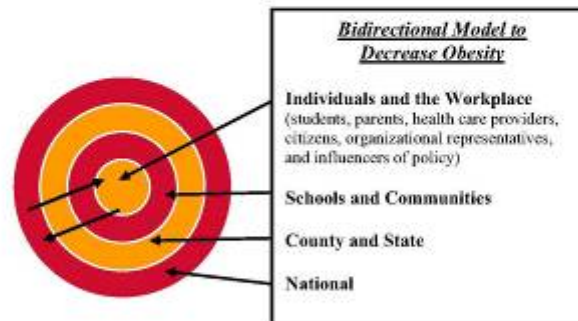

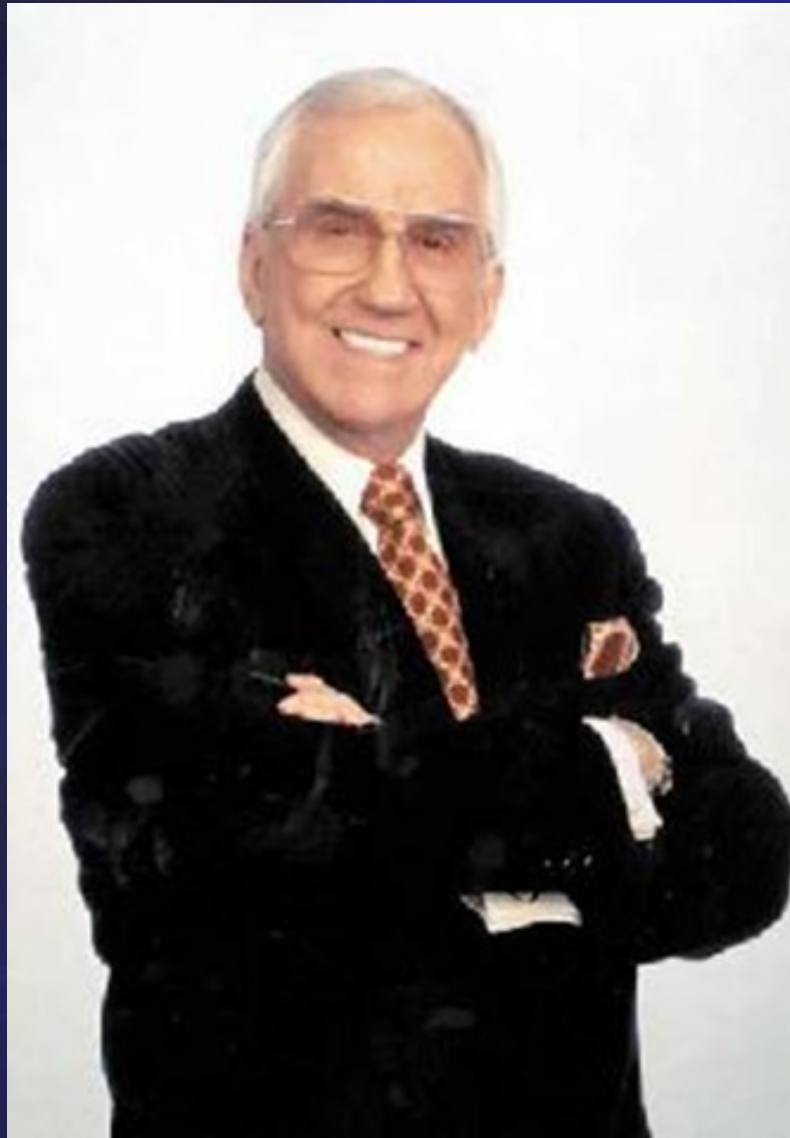

Problem:
The prevalence of obesity has increased dramatically in America and is now an epidemic. A new study on March 17, 2005 suggests that as childhood obesity becomes prevalent, the current generation of children may "live less healthful and shorter lives than their parents" for the first time in U.S. history. It has been estimated the health care costs attributable to obesity are greater than any other health condition.

The obesity epidemic is escalating rapidly, is complex in nature and, by its magnitude, is humbling all individuals and organizations striving to make a difference. It is only by all working together to approach the problem "that in hand" that we will create an environment for all people that supports physical activity and healthy nutrition.
